The Swiss clergy and laity instituted a collection after hearing from Archbishop Pia y Deniel that many of the churches in his See had been looted of vestments and other sacred articles in the Spanish Civil War and that aid to the churches and clergy was urgent.

**WHEELING, W. Va.** — His Holiness Pope Pius XII has elevated the Rev. Martin J. Egan, pastor of St. Anthony's Church, in Falls Church, W. Va., to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the title of Right Reverend Monsignor. The Most Rev. John J. Swint, Bishop of Wheeling, will formally invest Monsignor Egan as a Domestic Prelate at St. Joseph's Cathedral in Wheeling next month.

Monsignor Egan has three sisters who are Ursuline nuns. Sister Martin and Sister Margaret of "The Pines," Ursuline College at Chatham, Ontario, and Sister Theresa, of St. Ursula's Academy School of Music, at Windsor, Ontario.

## Opens Radio Station

**Lisbon** — Catholic Action in Portugal has established a new radio station called Radio Renaissance which is to be maintained and directed by a Catholic Radio organization. The organization is headed by the Rev. Lopes de Cruz and already has over 4,000 paying members. Its aim is to organize all Catholics of Portugal and her colonies after the example of the Catholic Radio organizations of the Netherlands, which played such a prominent part in cultural life of Holland until their suppression by the Nazis.
