MODERN PROGRESS IN ST. MARK'S LAND

St. Mark the Evangelist was the first bishop in Egypt. His see was Alexandria, and the Nile which he used, the Alexandria, is still, with some modifications, used there. Unfortunately, for fifteen centuries the majority of the Christians of the Alexandria Nile have been separated from Rome, but within two generations the Catholic Coptic (as they are known) have increased from 2,000 to 20,000. This progress has been made in spite of great opposition from the separated Orthodox Coptic and from the Mohammedans, who form a vast majority of the population of Egypt today.

Much of this progress has been due to the unselfish zeal of the Most Rev. Mark Mhommam, who has been Bishop and Patriarchal Vicar of the Coptic for many years. He has about 40 priests working with him, and these men, because of their devotion to their bishop, have won the respect of all. In many places even the Orthodox Coptic prefer them to their own priests.

The Coptic Christians are poor. Mohammedans have nearly all the wealth of the country. Hence the problem of priests' support bears heavily on the Coptic. The people have no money and the clergy look to the bishop for support. Only Twenty-Five Dollars a month is needed for the support of a Coptic Catholic priest. Please help us save for these men who are working to bring St. Mark's land back to the faith which he preached.
