Those who desire them may call at the school Monday evening after the services.

Monday, Aug. 18, at 5:00 P. M. in Robert Hall, distribution of all goods on hand will take place. Other items, such as rugs and towels, have been delayed by war conditions, but will be here later and members will be notified at time of their arrival.

Payment of balance on your membership fee should be made at once, so that there may be no delay in delivery of goods when they arrive. The last of your pink envelopes should be used now for this final payment; to put off payment until Aug. 23 will mean much confusion and delay, so make your payment now that we may be able to serve you quickly when you come to the School Hall on Aug. 23. All merchandise as ordered will arrive. Delays on some items are certain, but we ask you to be patient till your article arrives.

New Merchandise Club begins Sept. 15. Leaders will soon have the new catalogue and will be glad to explain to you the new items that shall make the new session of the Merchandise Club as attractive. New members are invited to plan now to join.

Look Here Latecomer!

Perhaps you come to Mass only a few minutes later, nevertheless you may cause half of the congregation to turn around at the sound of your footsteps, as you come up the aisle. The congregation should not look around, that is true, but we are dealing with human beings; and human beings do look around. Then the added noise from the congregation is loud enough to reach the priest, who is engaged in the most solemn act of his priestly day. Indirectly, therefore, you are the cause of distraction when there should be no distraction. Can you wonder or complain if the priest scolds you from the altar? Do not think that he is a crank, but remember that you are the contributing nuisance. Coming late may not be very faulty in itself at times, but its consequence can be faulty. There is a simple way to avoid the trouble, after studying out your own particular difficulty, you find that you regularly arrive for the nine o'clock Mass at five minutes past nine, make it a point to come to Mass at five minutes to nine and then if you continue to come five minutes late you will be on time. Always aim above what you hope to hit.—Anon.
