Order Of The Alhambra Lists 2-Day Business Session In New York

A wartime conference of members of the Order of the Alhambra will take delegates from Rochester's Moss Cayvan, to New York City, next week when the 20th Biennial convention of the organization will be held at Pennsylvania Hotel, August 25 and 26.

Rochester's delegation will include Grand Commander Norman S. Collins, Deputy Supreme Commander Frank H. Deacon, Grand Chamberlain William J. Wosny and Secy of the Executive Clarence M. Lufkin.

The original convention was scheduled for Philadelphia but was called off due to the war. The meeting in New York will be confined to business.

A notice sent to the members this week over the signatures of Supreme Commander Thomas J. Quinn and Supreme Secy G. Albert Peters, Jr., states:

"This Twentieth Biennial Convention will be unlike any Convention Alhambra has ever seen, and we hope, such as it will never see again. No trials, no furbelows, no entertainments, no trips — only business and the good fellowship that always prevails when Alhambra gets together. That's the result of war.

But who would have it otherwise? Surely, we as good Catholics, Knights and Alhambraans would have little heart in staging a convention such as we knew in other years when our brothers, our sons and our friends are fighting, bleeding and dying on foreign fields.

"We are told that we must sacrifice in a small way in order that they may have the means to make great sacrifices. We accept such small sacrifices willingly and cheerfully with the hope that we may in some small measure contribute to the final victory that will give us joy again — joy in the company of our fellow Alhambraans who are fighting for the very fundamentals of freedom that make Order's life ours possible."

The Rev. Robert G. Miller, C.S.B., son of Mr. and Mrs. William Miller, 179 Augustine Street, will sing his first Solemn Mass at 11 o'clock on Sunday, August 22, in the Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral.

Fr. Miller, a religious of the Congregation of St. Basil, was ordained last Sunday in St. Basil's Church, Toronto, by the Most Rev. Archbishop James C. McColgan.

Prests assisting Father Miller in his first Solemn Mass are: Assistant Priest, Fr. Rev. Msgr. George V. Ryan, pastor of the Sacred Heart Pro-Cathedral; Deacon, Rev. Frank J. Taylor, Assistant Pastor, St. Boniface Church; Sub-deacon, Rev. Francis M. Sheehan, C.S.B., St. Thomas College, Houston, Texas. The sermon will be preached by the Rev. Joseph L. O'Donnell, C.S.B., St. Michael's College, Toronto.

Father Miller's two brothers, also students for the priesthood, Mr. Thomas M. Miller, C.S.B., and Mr. Richard A. J. Miller, S.J., will participate at the Mass as Master of Ceremonies and Thurifer.

The newly-ordained priest is a graduate of Nazareth Hall and Aquinas Institute.

He received his B.A. degree from St. Michael's College, Toronto, and his M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies, Toronto.

Father Miller has been assigned to teach philosophy at St. Thomas More College, University of Saskatchewan, Saskatoon.

DESTROYER IS NAMED FOR ADMIRAL CALLAGHAN

LOS ANGELES — Tribute to another Catholic who is regarded as one of the outstanding heroes of the war was paid here last week when the destroyer "U.S.S. Callaghan" was christened and launched at the San Pedro plant of the Bethlehem Shipbuilding Corporation.

The destroyer honors the name of Rear Admiral Judson Callaghan, who was killed in action in the Solomon Islands, November 10, 1942, while on the bridge of the U. S. S. "San Francisco," a cruiser credited with having sunk ten times her tonnage of Japanese shipping.

AUBURN — The program "Sampson Goes To Church" is broadcast over station WSYR located in Syracuse every Sunday morning at 10 o'clock. The Catholic program which is heard on alternate Sundays consists of the celebration of Holy Sacrament of the Mass and a short sermon by the Chaplain and the singing of hymns by the Navy Choir.

The parts of the Mass are described by a member of the Navy personnel. The program originates in Sullivan Auditorium at the Sampson Naval Base and is dedicated to the mothers, wives, sweethearts and friends of the Navy-men.

The next Catholic program will be broadcast on Sunday, August 29. Father John Maxwell of the U. S. Navy, a priest of the Rochester Diocese, was in charge of last Sunday's broadcast.

Existence Of Mexico Tied To Catholic Faith

MEXICO CITY (NO) — "The existence of Mexico is bound to the Catholic Faith" was the theme of the assembly of the Catholic Association of Mexican Youth here on Saturday evening. The Most Rev. Luis M. Martinez, Archbishop of Mexico, in addressing the meeting said: "The Church numbers among Catholic youths the best, the most openly and most decided patriots in this hour of unrest, whether they be in the shops, the schools, the fields or in the ranks of the conscripts."

One point that was emphasized in discussion of the general theme was that the Catholic youth of Mexico is neither cowardly nor inert, and it is ready and willing to collaborate whenever and wherever it is called. "A young conscript," it was pointed out, "wherever he goes will find the outstretched hand of brotherhood among the Catholic youth, and not the menacingly clenched fist."
