### Awarded Second Hero Decoration

LONG PINE, Neb. — The Catholic hero son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Stec, of this community, Private Joseph Stec, who is on duty with the Army somewhere in the South Pacific area, has won his second decoration for heroism, according to advices received here. The reports stated Private Stec has been decorated with the Silver Star Medal. Some months ago he was awarded a Distinguished Service decoration after he and four other soldiers wiped out a Japanese nest of ten men, that was holding up the advance of American troops at a strategic point.

### Fifth Decoration For Slain Air Hero

ROCK ISLAND, Ill. — The multi-decorated Staff Sergeant Lawrence L. Holgate, of this city, who was killed in action with the Army Air Forces in North Africa, has been given two more awards for heroism posthumously, his parents Mr. and Mrs. J. E. Holgate, members of St. Joseph's parish, have been advised. The awards given Sergeant Holgate in death are the Purple Heart decoration and a third oak leaf cluster to a previously awarded air medal.

### Code of Canon Law Printed in Chinese

VATICAN CITY. — Printing of the Code of Canon Law in Chinese is announced in a cablegram from His Excellency Archbishop Mario Zanin, Apostolic Delegate to China. The Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith has rendered congratulations. Pioneer work in this direction was undertaken five years ago by Bishop Cyril Jarro, O.F.M., Vicar Apostolic of Tientsin. The work has involved great difficulty owing to the problems of translating juridical terminology into Chinese.

### Rescues Crew Of Burning Bomber

ST. LOUIS — The soldier's Medal for bravery has been awarded to Lieut. James E. Frick, an alumnus of St. Louis University and a resident of this city, for the rescue of the crew of a burning bomber which crashed at Camp Haan, Calif.
