prisoner of the Japanese government and is confined to a prisoner-of-war camp somewhere in the Philippine Islands. Kenny is one of six sons serving with Uncle Sam.

is serving with the Navy in Africa and Italy; Francis Kenny, 26, is with the troops in Louisiana; Alfred Kenny, 22, is with the Army in Florida; Charles Kenny, 20, is stationed with the Army in Greenland; and Samuel Kenny, 18, is a member of the Great Lakes Maritime Service.

Capt. William McKean, USA, QMC of 18 Union Street has reported for duty in Italy. He was formerly in the Africa area. McKean has been with the forces since June 25. Capt. McKean was formerly a courier for the Post Standard Newspaper in Auburn. He graduated from Holy Family High School and completed three years study of law at the University of Detroit before he was called for military training. After induction he trained at Camp Croft, S. C. until he was sent overseas.

Sgt. John W. Owen, M. U. S. M. C., who spent four months in action at Guadalcanal is home for a 30-day furlough. Owen, son of Mr. and Mrs. John E. Owen of 147 Lawrence Avenue, enlisted in the Marines in October, 1941 at Syracuse. He was a welding instructor at the Auburn NYA work experience resident center at the company grounds prior to his induction. Through all the service he saw in the far Pacific he came home without a wound or injury. The entire unit of which he was a member at Guadalcanal was awarded the presidential citation for action there. Sgt. Owen landed in the states in July. At the conclusion of his furlough he will report for duty at Camp Llewellyn, New River, N. C. for a new assignment. Sgt. Owen took his basic training at Fort Belvoir and then was sent to Quantico, Va. for special training in the telephone school from which he was graduated in February, 1942. In June he went to the Pacific war area. He was assigned to communication work. He arrived at Guadalcanal for four months.

O'Keefe, assistant pastor of St. Patrick's Church in Hancock Falls, former assistant at St. Mary's and at St. Thomas Church in Irondequoit, received a letter a week ago from his brother, Corporal Robert V. O'Keefe, 20, saying he is recuperating from injuries suffered while participating in the invasion of Italy. Corporal O'Keefe enlisted in the army on January 6, 1942 and received his basic training at Fort Benning, Ga. He has been overseas eight months.
