

### Transforms Garage Into Navy Chapel

Until ten months ago the chapel was a one-car garage for the "shipper" the medical officer in charge of the hospital. Then Lieut. Charles C. Riedel, U.S.N.R., of Chicago, a member of the Clero of St. Victor, obtained permission to convert the one-story gar-

age into a house of worship. Nurses, patients, and officers and particularly Navy chief petty officers, skilled in their trades, contributed to the building of the chapel. The only thing Father Riedel had to start with was a pair of carpenter's made by a Navy petty officer.

### BUREAUCRATIC BEARS

Some time ago, we attended, in a southern state, a patriotic celebration at which 20,000 citizens of the low and middle classes were present. The governor was the principal speaker.



This good man labors under the impression that he is the savior of his people, a hallucination kept alive by the leading newspapers in the state, which are partisan. His hallucination, some time back, animated mostly by political spite, had threatened to deprive the poor people of something essential to their welfare. They will never forget, because helpless people, more than others, are inclined to resent an injustice. When the governor arose to speak, a scattered noise was heard throughout the audience, which reminded one of the noise of a motor in need of lubrication. The disturbance could not be exactly called boisterous; but it certainly was not acclamatory.

The Constitution of the United States gives expression to the soul and spirit of the Declaration of Independence, which solemnly states, "All men are created equal." This essential fact is mostly overlooked or forgotten by the very ones who represent our government. Still, in the true interest of our democracy, the officers of the country—from the president down—are the people's servants.

**LUCKY IN ELECTION**  
This pertinent fact may well be stressed in these days when, in addition to the regular political leaders, an army of officeholders has been created by appointment. Who are these men? Like political electees, they may have come to their important positions through partisan preference and not so much because of their outstanding qualities and talents and their proven patriotic spirit. As a rule, the less qualified a man is, and the more fortunate he has been in drawing the lucky number, the more overbearing he will act in his official capacity.

Contrary to the popular belief that the government frowns on conventions and large gatherings during these critical days, Washington is anxious that these meetings be held so that a chance may be offered to stress the needs of the country and to inspire optimistic patriotism. No opportunity should be lost to inspire and increase a real love for country. The time will come when we shall have to fight for victory in the United States after the victory is won on foreign battlefields. There are bound to come into existence sentiments and conditions which cannot be effectively counteracted unless the vast majority of our people are united in their holy determination to protect and preserve the inalienable rights of all men guaranteed by the Declaration of Independence and our Constitution.
