Father Hohman, Noted Jesuit Educator, Dies

JERSEY CITY.—The Rev. Arthur Hohman, S.J., head of the chemistry department at St. Peter's College, has died here at St. Francis Hospital after an illness of a year.

He was born in Buffalo 56 years ago and entered the Society of Jesus in 1903 in Cleveland. Before he joined the faculty at St. Peter's College here ten years ago, he had been Professor of Chemistry at Canisius College, Buffalo; St. John's College, Philadelphia; Boston College and Georgetown University, Washington, D.C. He was the author of two textbooks.

Publish 4th Volume Of Papal Discourses

VATICAN CITY (NC) — The fourth volume of "Discourses and Radio Addresses of His Holiness Pope Pius XII" — corresponding to the fourth year of his Pontificate — has been released by the Vita e Pensieri publishing house. The 483-page volume contains 43 discourses and five radio addresses made between March 2, 1942, and March 1, 1943.

Among the discourses contained in the fourth volume is the series of Papal addresses to newswriters which constitute a treatise on the Christian family.
