Suddenly something hit me from behind and I found myself sprawled at the far side of the pavement. Sitting up half-dazed I saw out in the gutter an over-turned "express" wagon and the grinning and almost gloating visage of my seven-year-old nephew.

"Hello, Uncle!" he shouted. "I sure can go some, can't I?"

"Yes," I answered, rising slowly and trying out each limb separately. "I'll admit your speed, but I'm not a bit convinced of your steering ability."

"Oh, I can steer all right when I want to! You ought to see me steer the Buick all over town!"

I scolded at this boast, but after dinner we all went out for a drive and Dickie proved beyond any question his infallibility as a steerer. Up and down hills, around curves, in and out traffic we went. Dickie on his father's lap, steering with accuracy and full confidence, because he knew that behind his own little hands on the wheel, were the big strong, sure hands of his daddy.

This little episode is a simple

parallel to the Dogma of Papal Infallibility, which is merely that the head of the Church of Christ is preserved from teaching error in matters of faith or morals, due to the special assistance of the Holy Ghost, the Spirit of Truth.

The Pope may utter his own little "express" words with inaccuracy, but when this occasion arises for him to direct the motor car of God's revealed truths, the hands of the Holy Ghost are behind his on the wheel, to make certain that the faithful are guided unerringly in their beliefs.

From Peter to Paul XII there have been 200 popes but none of whom has defined a single Dogma which conflicted in any way with the dogmatic definitions of any other pope.

To the Catholic the dogma of Papal Infallibility is clear, logical and essential to the Church founded for all men for all time. Have we made this oft-misunderstood doctrine clearer and more logical to you?
