Reported As 'Missing'**

Alf. and Mrs. Dominic Brenzo of 1010 Major St. have been informed by the War Department that their son, Tech. Sgt. Henry S. Brenzo of the Army Air Corps has been missing in action over France since Nov. 11. He was a member of St. Anthony's Church.

A radio technician on a Flying Fortress, Sgt. Brenzo, 24, was stationed at the same time in North Africa. He entered the service May 25, 1942.

Graduated from School 10, Brenzo attended the Elmira Free Academy and was employed by the Elmira Star-Gazette, Inc., for several years. Before entering the Army last year he was foreman of the Sunday Telegram mailing department.

A brother, Lt. Mark Brenzo of the Army Air Corps, served in England two weeks ago.
