Mr. and Mrs. Dominick Brenzo of 1010 Major St. have been informed by the War Department that their son, Tech. Sgt. Henry S. Brenzo of the Army Air Corps has been missing in action over France since Nov. 10. He was a member of St. Anthony's Church.

A radio technician on a Flying Fortress, Sgt. Brenzo, 26, was stationed in some town in North Africa. He captured the service May 25, 1944.

Graduate from School 10, Brenzo attended the Elmira Free Academy and was employed by the Elmira Star-Gazette, Inc., for several years. Before entering the Army last year he was foreman of the Sunday Telegram mailing department.

A brother, Lt. Mark Brenzo of the Army Air Corps, arrived in England two weeks ago.
