Second son of Mrs. Teresa Scalzo, 313 Broad St., Waverly to suffer wounds in action in the present war, Pvt. William D. (Tommy) Scalzo was reported by the War Department as seriously wounded in Italy, his mother has been informed.

His brother, Corp. Louis J. Scalzo holds the Order of the Purple Heart for wounds received Dec. 7, 1941.

Private Scalzo was injured on Sunday, Nov. 14 which coincided with a communiqué issued by Allied headquarters in Algiers reporting that three counter-attacks by the 29th German panzer grenadiers was smashed by U. S. troops.

Joining the army in June 1940, following his graduation from Waverly High School the year before, he entered the field artillery. Overseas almost a year he has been in action in Tunisia and Sicily.
