

Alumnae Hear Bishop Stress Leadership

NEW YORK. Leadership which combines "the leadership of principle and the leadership of the individual, collectively expressed" is needed today to combat the "collectivism" of groups led by persons who are concerned only with "policy and expediency," the Most Rev. J. Francis A. McIntyre, Auxiliary Bishop of New York, declared at the annual Communion breakfast of the New York Circle of the International Federation of Catholic Alumnae.

A warning that post-war education might become so materialistic and "utilitarian" that traditional Christian principles might be omitted from it was uttered by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Philip J. Furlong, principal of Cardinal Hayes High School.

Msgr. Furlong said that education after the war might revert to the "pre-Pearl Harbor" type or a modification of it which telescoped the curriculum in a manner similar to the accelerated programs in colleges where army specialized training is given today. The third possibility he called a "revolutionary system."

"This would extend itself into the nursery, thus invading the home, and into adult life through adult education," he said, adding that although he could not define the "precise character" of the system it would be "materialistic and intensely utilitarian." ***




