Supreme Court Awards Church Property To Bishop McAuliffe

BRIDGEPORT, Conn. — In a four-to-one opinion, the Supreme Court of Connecticut has handed down a decision favoring the Most Rev. Maurice F. McAuliffe, Bishop of Hartford, and other plaintiffs in a suit concerning title to the property of the Greek Catholic Church of St. John the Baptist here.

The decision, ending nearly six years of legal controversy, sustained the findings of Judge Ernest A. Inglis of Superior Court, affirming an error in his "scholarly" decision of Sept. 17, 1941, in which the property title issue was found in favor of the Diocese of Hartford.

"Title to church property of a divided congregation is in that part of it which adheres to the ecclesiastical laws accepted among them before the dispute began," the decision stated. "The church was founded as a Uniate church (united with Rome), and continued as such for 30 years until Bishop Chornock's altercation with the Roman Catholic church arose. The church 'claimed life' from the Roman Catholic Church in Connecticut for 30 years, and cannot suddenly repudiate this allegiance. The congregation or any part of it may change its faith at will, but it may not possess and control this particular property. All legal technicalities concerning the title were cured with the full knowledge and consent of the congregation. The determinative factor is the status of the church before the dispute began, not after."

Origin of Controversy

The controversy over title to the property began in 1930, when the then pastor of the church, now the Rt. Rev. Orestes P. Chornock, bishop of the Carpatho-Russian Catholic Church in North and South America, became involved in a dispute with his ecclesiastical superior and was subsequently excommunicated.

Following refusal of Bishop Chornock to surrender the property of the church, including the church edifice, rectory, school and hall, suit was brought by Bishop McAuliffe seeking a declaratory judgment determining the rightful owner of the property.

Our soldiers and sailors abroad literally worship the Red Cross and I personally can find nothing but praise to say about its program as I saw it in operation.

Red Cross Clubs Rival Chain Hotels

Rivalling the record of large hotel chains, the eighty-six American Red Cross Service clubs in the British Isles, as of late 1944, had a total daily sleeping accommodation for 16,300 personnel and facilities for daily service of 184,700 malt meals and snacks.
