Nazareth Poetry Accepted For National Anthology

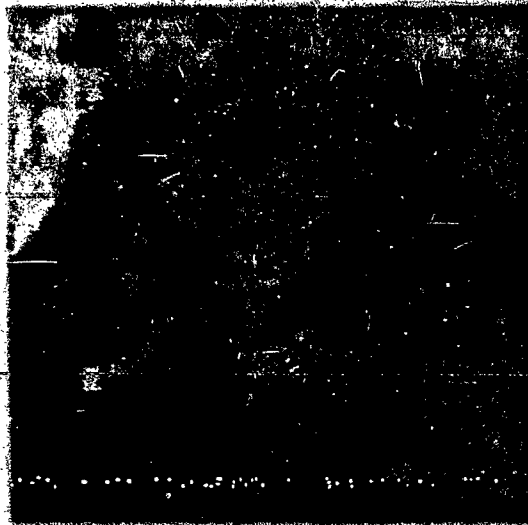
The National High School Poetry Association, Los Angeles, Calif., has announced the acceptance of poems by three Nazareth Academy students for their annual Spring Anthology.
