

**QUEBEC**, Que. — On behalf of the Archbishops and Bishops of Quebec Province, His Eminence Cardinal Joseph-Cardinal Villeneuve, Archbishop of Quebec, has broadcast an appeal for funds, clothes and other necessities of life for the people of France. The aggressions of war has prevented such aid being given in the past, but His Eminence said it was hoped that means would soon be available to assure this necessary aid to the people of France. While it might not be possible immediately to deliver these necessities, His Eminence pointed out the urgency of having such collections made so that they would be available when deliveries are made possible.

### Condemns Nazi Ungodliness

**WASHINGTON**.—In a pastoral letter, the Most Rev. Konrad Groeber, Archbishop of Freiburg-im-Breisgau, Germany, again attacked "National Socialist ungodliness and philosophy," according to the Swedish newspaper *Dagens Nyheter*, the Office of War Information here reports.

In his condemnation of Nazi philosophy, the Archbishop is reported to have said that no sooner does a ruling group become ungodly than it wants to start a new cultural epoch in which the people are deprived of God's image and are told to be satisfied instead with their descent from the apes.

Archbishop Groeber, the paper said, exhorted the German people to preserve their forefather's holy heritage and not be misguided and fooled by "those whose madness already has been described in Holy Writ."
