Here are the names they have chosen for their pagan babies: Joseph, Anthony, Eugene Francis, Mary, Rose and Bernadette Marie. Splendid work, boys and girls.

The boys and girls of the Fourth and Fifth Grades of St. Vincent de Paul's School, Corning, are still 100% behind the missions. This time they have asked for an African baby to be named James. I shall see that your wishes are fulfilled, boys and girls.

Here is a school that we can always count on to help us out. That is St. John's, Clyde. I received three letters from these children. One was from the little kindergartners. They have worked real hard and now they want a baby from Selma, Ala. They gave this baby the beautiful name of Rose Marie in honor of the Blessed Virgin. The pupils of the Third and Fourth Grades saved \$6 for the ransom of a North American baby girl. They chose the name "Mary Ann" after the Blessed Mother and St. Ann. The third letter was from Leona Stanziana, a pupil of the

Sixth Grade. Leona has ransomed a baby all by herself with money that she earned. Her choice of a name is Paul. Leon, and it is to be given to an American Indian.

Catholic Hour Drama To Be 'Dark Secret'

NEW YORK.—The moving story of a Negro prisoner who unfolded to a chaplain his "Dark Secret" the night he faced electrocution is told on "The Catholic Hour," Sunday, May 14 (NBC, 8:00 P. M. EWTN).

Related through the eyes of a new prison chaplain, "Dark Secret" concerns a Negro, who three days before he was to face the electric chair refused to prepare himself for death. It was not until the last day, when the prisoner was confronted with his lover, that he began to understand the power of God. Just before he went to the chair, he accepted the message of the Gospel and told the chaplain his "Dark Secret." Climax of the drama comes when the chaplain reveals that a white man later confessed to the crime for which the Negro died.

Fifth in a series of six special dramatizations, this episode of "The Catholic Hour" was written by Father Timothy Mulvey, of the Chancery of Mary Immaculate. Production is directed by Herbert Rice and original music is composed and conducted by Leo Kampinski. "The Catholic Hour" is presented each week over NBC by the National Council of Catholic Men.
