30,000,000 Catholics In U. S. Say Writers

the writers in the Ecclesiastical ex-
plain:

"In the first place, the Catholic
Directory from year to year does
not accord for some decrease a suf-
ficient increase. There are dioceses
which have had the same es-
timates for many years. Still other
dioceses have their own estimates
which are at variance with the es-
timates of the Catholic Directory.
One Directory Office reported that
its own estimate was 19,000,000 in ex-
cess of the Catholic Directory."

In the southern dioceses where
the presumption is that generally
the Negro is not Catholic, the Ec-
clesiastical Review writers ob-
tained estimates which were
greatly in excess of those of the
Catholic Directory.

The average estimate of
30,000,000 Catholics, Fathers
Kelly and Coogan make special
appeal to the national birth rate.
They argue:

"In the United States there are
about 14 women of child-bearing
age (15-44) for every child born.
Further, there are slightly more
than 4 people in the general popu-
lation for every woman of child-
bearing age (15-44). . . Since there
were 530,000 Catholic children born
in 1940, there should be 7,000,000
Catholic women aged 15-44, which
would demand a Catholic popula-
tion of 31,000,000."

Arguing for a figure far higher
than that of the Catholic Direc-
tory, the Ecclesiastical writers also
note that "the life expectancy of
people in the United States is
about 63 years." Thus they con-
clude, "550,000 Catholic children
born with a life expectancy of 43
years requires a Catholic popula-
tion of some 34,000,000 to produce
them."

Sister M. Lelia Corcoran
Funeral services for Sister M.
Lelia Corcoran of the Congrega-
tion of the Sisters of St. Joseph
at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, on
Monday morning. Solemn Mass of
Requiem was celebrated by the
Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns,
Pastor of the Pro-Cathedral of the
Sacred Heart, assisted by the Rev.
John T. Callahan, assistant of the
Pro-Cathedral, as Deacon, and the
Rev. Thomas F. McVeigh, assist-
ant of Corpus Christi, as Sub-dea-
con. The Rev. Joseph H. Gefell,
Chaplain of Nazareth Convent, was
Master of Ceremonies. The Rev.
John S. Hayes and the Rev. Ed-
ward J. Lantz served as Acolytes.
The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M.
Hart, V.G., the Rev. Francis W.
Luddy, the Rev. William Shannon,
the Rev. Edward J. McNamara, and
the Rev. Robert F. McNamara
were present in the Sanctuary.
Interment was made in the Sa-
cristy Plot in Holy Sepulchre Cen-
tury, and the last blessing was
given by Father Gefell, assisted by
Monsignor Burns, Father McNamara
and Father Callahan.

Sister Lelia died on Saturday,
May 20, 1944, at Nazareth Con-
vent, Pittsford, after an illness of
a few weeks. She was born in
Ireland and was in the 26th year
of her Religious life.

Sister Lelia taught a number of
years in the Catholic Schools of
the Diocese of Rochester, including
St. Patrick's School, Gouging; St.
Anthony's, St. Francis Xavier's and
Corpus Christi Schools of Roch-
ester. At the time of her illness,
she was teaching at Sacred Heart
Pro-Cathedral School.

She is survived by her mother,
Mrs. Margaret Corcoran; one sis-
ter, Mrs. Naughton; two brothers,
James and Martin, all of Ireland;
one brother, John J. Corcoran of
Jersey City, N. J., and two sisters,
Mrs. M. J. Gallagher of Geneva
and Mrs. Delia Dillon of Chicago,
Ill.
