Chinese Catholic Is Named U. S. Envoy To Chungking

NEW YORK—Albert Lee, prominent Catholic member of the Boston Chinese community, has been sent by the U. S. State Department on a secret mission to Chungking.

Born in Toi Shan, China, 22 years ago, Mr. Lee came to the United States as a youth. His father is a member of the Kow Ming Tung, the Chinese national committee. Mr. Lee attended Northeastern University and Boston College and returned to China to attend Sun Yat Sen University.

A member of the Immaculate Conception Parish, Boston, Mr. Lee was instructed and received into the Catholic Church by the Most Rev. Paul Yu Pin, Vicar Apostolic of Nanking, in 1926.

"When there is no work they seek to my mission house and cry for bread or even a little boiled rice. "With such a state of affairs I shall never be able to build my chapel. Right now I say Mass on an open perch."

Well, we shall answer Father Sequiera this time, that is, you will answer him. With your help we intend to send him three hundred dollars at once for his starving people.
