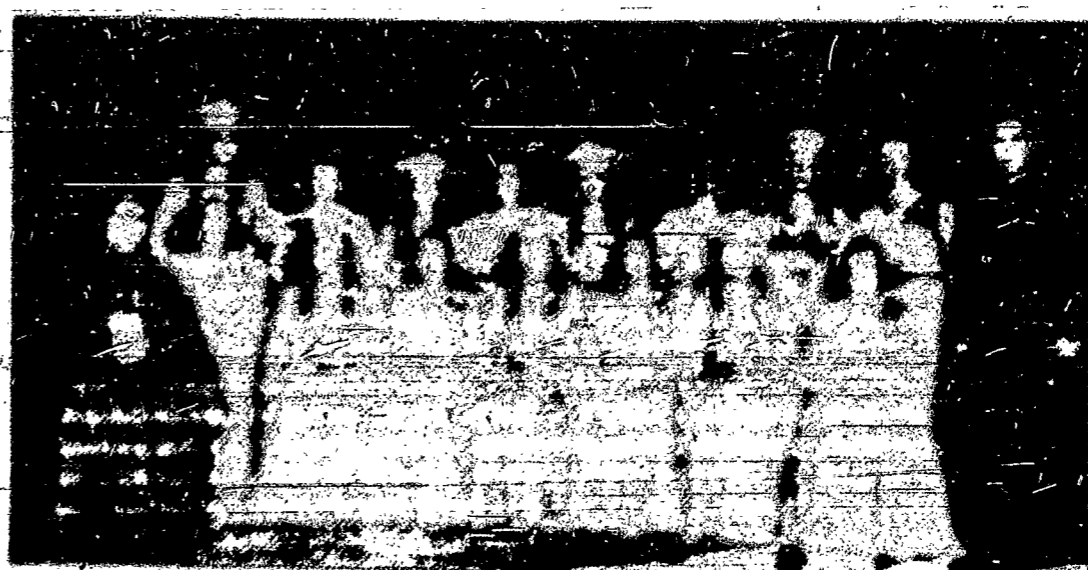

Bishop Commends First St. Agnes High Graduates

At the first graduation exercises of St. Agnes High School on June 28, seven members of the class of 1944 received diplomas from the hands of His Excellency, Bishop Kearney.

The program took place at the Memorial Art Gallery Theater. After the processional, Schumann's "Traumerel" rendered on the violin by Elaine Robinson, the St. Agnes choir sang several numbers, followed by a violin solo by Colette Stanley. The graduates were then presented by the Rev. Roy E. Morphy and were awarded diplomas by Bishop Kearney. Helen Murrer gave the Valedictory.

In his address, the Bishop congratulated the class of 1944 on its accomplishments and reminded them of the distinction that is theirs in being the first class to graduate from St. Agnes High School, founded only four years ago.

He had an earnest word of praise and congratulation for the Sisters at St. Agnes, whose patron has been his own from his early years when he was an altar boy at St. Agnes Church in New York City. Welcoming St. Agnes High School, newly chartered by the New York State Department of Education, into the great family of schools of the Rochester Diocese, the Bishop asked a blessing for its future, and concluded by saying that he anticipated great good from its work among the young women of the diocese.

St. Willibrord, the son of St. Hilgis, served as Bishop of Utrecht and Apostle of the Frisians during the eighth century. He spent many years of his life in missionary activities in the northern countries and the Scandinavian peninsula. He was assisted in a part of his task by St. Boniface.
