Tar Heel Apostle Presented in Book

NEW YORK — "Tar Heel Apostle," to be published August 23, is the story of the Rev. Thomas Frederick Price (1850-1939), co-founder of Maryknoll, the Catholic Foreign Mission Society of America.

Written by the Rev. John C. Murrell, M. M., from historical data assembled by the Rev. George C. Powers, of Maryknoll, "Tar Heel Apostle" presents the picture of a missionary who worked for a quarter of a century among his own people in North Carolina while lecturing, writing and striving in every way to promote the idea of a foreign apostolate in this country.

Refusing to be dispirited when doors were slammed in his face, sleeping in haylofts when nothing better was available, being ordered away by shotgun-carrying farmers, Father Price carried on his work of winning souls by patience, kindness, humility and charity in the "Tar Heel" State, where few persons had ever heard anything good of the Catholic Church.

The meeting of Father Price and Father Walsh and their eventual union in founding the Maryknoll Mission, is graphically related in "Tar Heel Apostle."

Father Murrell, author of the volume, is a native of Buffalo. He was ordained in 1933, was for three years assistant editor of the Maryknoll magazine, The Field Ajar, and later served at mission posts on the Pacific Coast and in Manchuria. In 1937 he was recalled to this country to become first rector of Maryknoll Junior Seminary in Akron. "Tar Heel Apostle" is published by Longmans, Green and Co.

Venezuela Reds Get Free Speech

CARACAS — The clause in the Venezuelan Constitution prohibiting Communist propaganda has been eliminated after a long debate, the Government announcing that as long as the clause remained in the Constitution the Communist movement in this country was an "underground" movement, and that a regularly organized and recognized Communist Party would be easier to keep within bounds. Opponents argued that despite the organization of a Communist Party, Venezuelan Communists would still pursue a "penetration" policy.

President Isaias Medina Angarita, in a statement of the ability of the Venezuelan people to withstand "Communist propaganda," said that their good sense and common judgment would be the price of arms for combating exotic doctrines.

The Constitutional change has convinced Catholic circles that it is more important than ever to be vigilant. Some think that the elimination of the restriction from the Constitution will prove fatal to the Republic; others believe that the free propagation of Communism will afford opportunity for a better defense of Catholic principles.

Lakeside Villa Given to Jesuits

DETROIT — As the result of a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Elmer J. Smith, parishioners of St. Peter and Paul Church here, a summer villa for Jesuit faculty members of the University of Detroit has been established near Kingsville, Ont. Formerly known as the Crawton Inn, the villa has a beach frontage of 282 feet on Lake Erie and accommodations for 35 persons. Built 15 years ago and valued at \$20,000, the estate now has been named Xavier Villa.
