War Action Takes Lives of 10 Catholic Boys, 5 Are Wounded

Ten Catholic boys have gone to their eternal rewards as a result of participation in the present war; five have suffered wounds, one has been reported safe again after having been reported missing and one is a prisoner of war, the week's casualty reports show.

(Items reported here from August 28 to Sept. 4)

Pvt. Richard J. DeRow, 21, son of J. P. DeRow, 420 South Ave., was killed in action in France, June 11, according to word received by his brother, William B. DeRow, 210 Sanford St. Attached to the Army Engineers, Pvt. DeRow had 18 months' service, five overseas. A graduate of Blessed Sacrament School, he was a farmer before joining the Army. Besides his father and brother, he leaves two other brothers, John and George, and a sister, Mrs. Frederick Rhode, all of Rochester.

Sgt. Samuel A. Trabalzi, 22, was killed in action in France Aug. 13, the War Department has notified his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis J. Trabalzi, 194 Stinson St. Following graduation from Aquinas Institute, Sgt. Trabalzi worked at the Rochester Folding Box Company until entering the Army Infantry Dec. 2, 1942. Surviving are his parents, two sisters, Angelina and Jean; two brothers, Anthony and Louis Jr., and several aunts and cousins. His fiancée is Miss Grace Cowles of 100 Belmont.

Tech, Fifth Grade Leo P. Contestabile, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Contestabile, 28 Lorimer St., died of meningitis in England Aug. 11, after going through the invasion of France. Overseas since last February, Technician Contestabile had been serving with an amphibian command. A graduate of St. Anthony's School and Edison Technical High, he was inducted in April, 1943. He is survived by six brothers, Corp Phillip Contestabile, stationed in England; Felix, Vincent Jr., Adrian, Anthony, William, and two sisters, Lena and Mary.

Pvt. John F. White, son of the late John G. White, former president of the Bricklayers' Local AFL here, died Monday, Aug. 28, as the result of an accident. Stationed near New York City to await overseas transfer, he was struck down by a hit-and-run driver in Hempstead, L. I. Formerly a resident of Rochester, at 98 Warwick, Private White was living in Hyattsville, Md., before he joined the Army. A graduate of St. Augustine's School and Cook Academy, Montour Falls, he also studied at Aquinas Institute and Niagara University Extension Division here. Survivors include his

A graduate of Holy Family School and former student at Aquinas Institute, Pvt. Zimmer was for 13 years an employe of W. B. Coon Company, before he entered the Army Infantry. He was sent overseas on Mar. 17 of this year, following training at Camp Croft, N. C. Besides his wife and parents, he leaves a son, Richard Arthur, 13 months; five brothers, Sgt. Raymond, Army Air Corps, England; Corp. Harold, France; Staff Sgt. Charles, Newfoundland; Master Sgt. Robert, Hawaii, and Herbert of Rochester; a sister, Mrs. Herbert May, and a grandmother, Mrs. Rose Schwartzmeier, both of this city, and several aunts and uncles.
