Academy of Sacred Heart Opens Year on Sept. 11

Academy of the Sacred Heart will reopen for its nineteenth scholastic year on Monday, Sept. 11. Pupils are asked to report between two and five o'clock to attend to all preliminary arrangements, so that regular classes may begin on Tuesday morning. The classes will start after the Mass of the Holy Ghost, to be celebrated at 8:30 A. M. in the convent chapel by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney.

The academy was first opened in 1855, in the Ellwood house on North St. Paul Street, with an enrollment of 35 pupils. The growth of the school soon exceeded the capacity of this house, and in 1863 the present property at 8 Prince Street was acquired.

Three wings have since been added to the original house, the last being a complete classroom building, connected by a bridge with the main structure. The gymnasium, built in 1931, is a separate building.

The school is run according to the country day school plan, with classes until 5:15, followed by sports under a competent instructor. The large garden includes hockey and baseball fields, tennis court, ice-skating rink and toboggan slide, with special recreational equipment for the kindergarten and primary grades. Attractive dormitories and private rooms provide accommodation for a limited number of weekly and permanent boarders.

The classes extend from the primary grade through the four years of high school, including a complete college preparatory course, with optional subjects for students who desire a more general course.

Good Counsel Group Leads In Record Blood Donation

Blood donors set a new record for the Red Cross Blood Donor Center at the special Labor Day opening, by contributing 250 pints, nearly half again as many as the original goal of 170, it is reported.

Arrest Bishop Who Refused to Say Mass For Vichy Official

NEW YORK (NC)—The Most Rev. Louis Rastoull, Bishop of Limoges, was arrested by the Gestapo in July and transferred to Chateauroux, the British radio revealed, according to a report received here at the Office of War Information.

The Bishop's arrest, the source said, followed his refusal to offer Mass for Philippe Henriot, Vichy propaganda minister executed by patriots in June. His Excellency refused the broadcast stated, because the Gestapo had prevented him from holding a service in memory of the victims of the Oradour-sur-Glane massacre in Haute Vienne.
