Sponsor Decent Literature Drive

BUFFALO, N. Y. — (RNS) — An intensive campaign against salacious literature is being planned by this city's Permanent Committee on Public Decency, composed of representatives of the Protestant, Catholic and Jewish faiths, for Nov. 12-19.

Tentative plans call for special radio programs, the showing of film shorts in theaters, addresses by representatives of the committee before luncheon clubs and other civic organizations, exhibits in public libraries showing the effects of indecent literature on youthful minds. The intensive period of the campaign will be followed by three months of similar activity.

"We do not wish to make this effort, or any effort put forth by the committee in its fight for clean literature a mere flash in the pan," explained the Rev. Joseph E. Schneider, chairman of the committee and diocesan director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.

GOAL TOPPED IN DIOCESAN DRIVE FOR POST-WAR WORK

SPRINGFIELD, Ill. — In less than ten days after the opening of the \$500,000 Bishop's Drive, the Diocese of Springfield over-subscribed its goal.

Reports of subscriptions to the half-million dollar fund which the diocese is raising for post-war uses of the church and its activities showed a total of \$511,796.

The fund had been organized by Bishop James A. Griffin for emergencies throughout the diocese after the war has been ended.
