—was one of the twelve who were called to the apostolate by the Saviour. He carried the Gospel through the most barbarous countries of the East, penetrating into the remotest Indies. He was martyred in Armenia.

A telegram was also addressed to President Roosevelt protesting Russian refusal to aid the beleaguered Polish defenders of Warsaw and petitioning the United States to send immediate relief to the besieged city.

Polish Diplomat Heard Addressing the meeting, which marked the fifth anniversary of the invasion of Poland, Ignacy Matyasewski former Polish minister of finance, declared: "It is not for the American people to choose between Poland and Russia but between Russia and justice, Russia and honor, Russia and the security of the United States."

"If Poland is given in appeasement to Russia, all the free nations between Germany and Russia will automatically fall under Russian domination," he predicted. Also addressing the group, the Rev. Patrick J. Flynn, associate editor of the CATHOLIC COURIER, hailed Poland as the historic outpost of Catholic Europe and as one of the first cradles of democracy not only in Europe but the whole world.

"A strange conspiracy of silence has kept the truth about suffering Poland mostly a secret," he said and added, "today Poland has been abandoned by the statesmen of the world and now all she has left is God. When the true history of Poland during this war has been written, honest men will read those pages with shame."

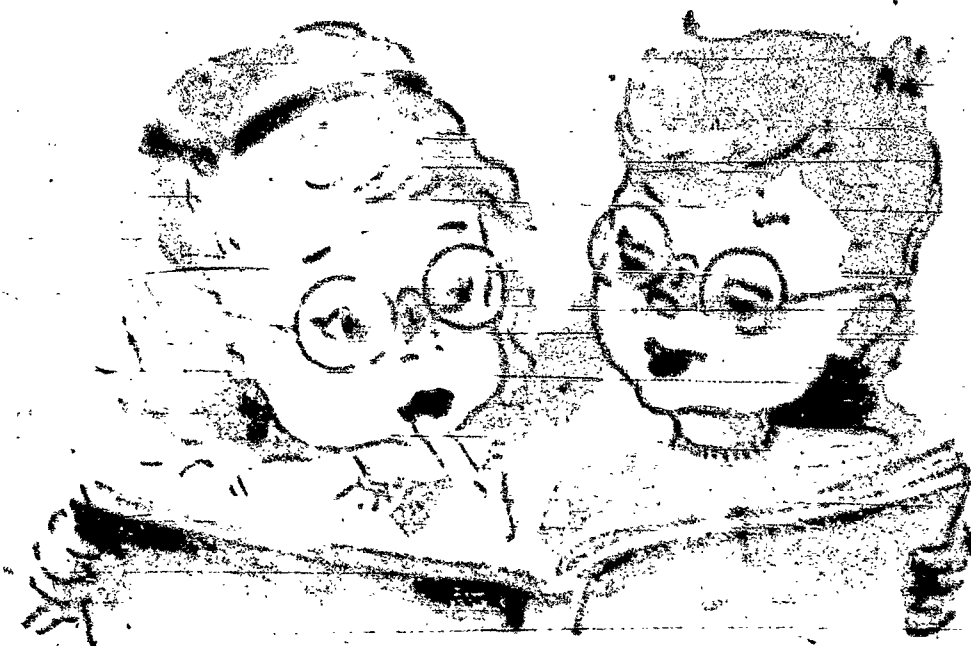
