SOME ONE TALKED

The slogans or warnings posted conspicuously in defense plants, on governmental property and around public gathering places have without question prevented much valuable information from reaching the enemy. In proportionate measure, our country has been spared interference with its war program. But we can well believe the admonition that there have been slip-ups with resultant damage to war materiel and loss of life. The usual explanation given is that "someone talked."

These words "someone talked" have resulted in harm to the religious program of our country as well as to the war program. Let us cite an actual incident. One morning three people were coming out of a Catholic church. Two of these were white and the third was a Negro. Whether it was the first time a colored person had appeared at the church, we do not know and it should not matter. One of the white parishioners was heard to remark, "What's HE doing here!" Certainly, an unChristlike remark! And the result was that the Negro Catholic never did go back to that church and remained away from all churches for over forty years. The explanation is given in the words already quoted, "someone talked."

How Many 'Lost'
In addition to remaining away from the church, this colored man did not appear before a priest at the time of his marriage; nor did he obtain for his family the benefit of the Sacraments and his children were never taught the truths of our holy religion — all because "someone talked." How many descendants of this Negro are "lost" to the Faith because of the exclamation uttered one day long ago, only God knows. At times, as in the story given above, the victim has returned to the Sacraments before death. But more often the offended individuals have severed completely their church membership because they

convinced themselves that adherents of the True Religion would surely act like Jesus Christ, the Founder, and extend a glad welcome to all, no matter what their color, race or nationality.

If the illustration of the clutching hand of a drowning patriot serves to remind us of what has happened because "someone talk-

ed" in war-time, what fear should be inspired by the realization that the "image and likeness of God" will accuse the guilty in each instance that a person explains his neglect of religion on the ground that "someone talked!" Let us ever be on guard lest we be guilty when the accusation is made, "someone talked." — The Catholic Herald.
