

# Reveal Nazi Persecution Of Lublin Catholics

**MOSCOW (By Wireless)**—Details of the Nazi persecution of Catholics in Poland were revealed here in latest reports from Lublin describing the tragic fate of Lublin Catholic University.

Immediately upon arrival in the city, the Germans began to occupy the university as a barracks until the entire building had been taken over by soldiers.

Many of the school's professors were arrested. The university rector, Father Szimanski, was first subjected to house arrest and then held under very suspicious and mysterious circumstances.

The Germans imprisoned Fathers Kremer, Nohal and Vops, all professors of theology; Professor of Law Martyniak, Professor of History Krasowski and Professor of Canonical Law Kalva, and many others.

A number of professors were reported killed, among them the famous Polish scientist, Jusef Kirkenmaler.

The work of reviving Lublin University has been placed in the

hands of Professor Biakowski and Professor Father Kruszinski.

Further details of the persecution of Catholics in Lublin are now being collected and will be released soon.

## HURRICANE DOES \$100,000 RUIN TO JAMAICA MISSIONS

**NEW YORK (NC)**—Damage estimated at between \$75,000 and \$100,000 was sustained by Church property in the Vicariate of Jamaica as a result of the recent hurricane, according to word received by the British Office of Information here.

The report stated that the buildings of seven mission stations of the Vicariate were destroyed, while the buildings of eight other stations were damaged. It also stated that slight damage was sustained by Church property in a dozen locations in the Vicariate.

Sixty-four million persons are now gainfully employed.

In the southern textile industry in December, 1943, worker earnings averaged 57 cents an hour. This is \$1070 a year for a 40-hour week.

Through March, 1944, more than 5,000,000 employees have participated in National Labor Relations Board elections.

In 1941, two-thirds of corporation dividends went to persons with incomes over \$5,000.

## MARYKNOLL HEAD IN CHINA TALKS WITH LEADERS

**CHUNGKING (NC-By Cable)**—The Most Rev. James E. Walsh, Superior General of Maryknoll, after a brief stay in Chungking, has left the Chinese capital to visit Maryknoll missions in South China.

The Sino-American Cultural Association gave a dinner here in honor of Bishop Walsh. Chen Lee Fu, Minister of Education, presided. Bishop Walsh gave an address

in Chinese and in English. Chungking's interest in American opinion is revealed by the fact that Sun Fo, Chinese leader, who requested Bishop Walsh to visit him, discussed China's problems with His Excellency for an hour and a quarter. Mr. Hoh, Minister of War, likewise spoke for over an hour with His Excellency. Bishop Walsh also was a guest at the American, Australian, Brazilian, Polish embassies here.
