Lieut. Munroe Due Home

Mr. and Mrs. Charles D. Munroe have received word that their son, Lieut. C. Donald Munroe, of the U. S. Army, who has been overseas since January, 1943, may be expected home within the next few weeks.

Lieutenant Munroe, who was a pilot in a fighter plane, saw active service in the campaigns of North Africa, Sicily and Italy. Early in March he was forced to abandon his plane somewhere off the coast of Africa and after swimming for more than an hour, he reached a small village somewhere in Africa. He was told the location of an American unit and walked for about twelve hours before arriving at the unit. He escaped with only a few bruises and scratches. He completed the required number of missions a few months ago and recently has been in the Ferry Command.

He enlisted in January, 1942, and received his wings and commission at Spence Field, Moultrie, Ga., in August of that year.
