

# 3 Servicemen Make Supreme Sacrifice

Three Catholic boys have been called to their eternal rewards on the field of battle, the war casualties reported from various fronts show this week. Two more Catholic boys have been wounded and one is missing in action.

Sgt. Victor J. Motejunas, 24, member of an armored regiment, was killed in action in France July 29, according to information received by his sister, Mrs. Constance Gudell, 935 Ave. D. Enlisting February 18, 1941, he was among the American troops who led the invasion in North Africa. He was

stationed in England from December until D-Day. Sergeant Motejunas, formerly an active member of the Gales Athletic Club, graduated from Benjamin Franklin High School.

Sgt. Calvin F. Bonaldi, 25, son of Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Bonaldi, 211 Saratoga Ave., has been officially declared dead by the War Department. The sergeant, a tail gunner on a Flying Fortress has been missing since May 3, 1943, when his plane is believed to have gone down in the Mediterranean Sea. A former student at Jefferson High School, he was employed by the city before entering the service. Surviving, besides his parents, are three brothers, Pvt. Otto Bonaldi, overseas; Pvt. Edmund Bonaldi, stationed in Florida; and Albert of Rochester, also several sisters of this city.

Mrs. Grace DeFlorio, 15 Harris St., has received word that her brother, Sgt. James J. Marine, 20, was killed in action on Guam July 26. Overseas for less than a year, Sergeant Marine had three years of service in the Marine Corps and took part in the New Caledonia and Bougainville fighting. For his handling of pistol, bayonet and sub-machine gun, he had been awarded an expert rating. Requiem High Mass of memorial was offered for Sergeant Marine Saturday morning in St. Andrew's Church.

Sgt. Frederick F. Fink, paratrooper, was wounded in the D-Day landing in France and returned to action the same day. The son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Fink, 442 Electric, Sgt. Fink graduated from Aquinas Institute. Formerly employed by the Haloid Co., he enlisted in November, 1942 and went overseas last January. Since being wounded, he has seen action and has returned to England.

Wounded in action in France, Pfc. Jos. A. Bernardino, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gaetano Bernardino of 38 Second St., has been in the hospital since August 21, his par-

ents have learned. His injuries, incurred while participating in armored tank operations, were not of a serious nature, the report said. A member of St. Francis Xavier parish, Private Bernardino was employed at the Carhart Photographic Laboratories, before he entered service.

Sgt. Benedict Camello, 18, ball

turret gunner on a Liberator, has been missing in action since Aug. 29, according to reports received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Sylvester Camello, 89 Delmar. Last seen over Yugoslavia, the young gunner had completed only half a dozen missions. A graduate of Aquinas Institute, Sgt. Camello entered the service in July, 1943 and left this country Aug. 2, 1944.

# Rochester Nun Forced to Flee Jap Invasion of China

MARYKNOLL, N. Y. — Among fourteen Maryknoll Sisters in the Koying area of South China who have congregated in their convent at Tungshak to continue their labors, is Sister Mary Magdalena Ur-lacher of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, Rochester.

Forced to flee from their mission convents during the recent Japanese attempt to take the Hankow-Canton railroad, the Sisters took up residence at the Tungshak convent in order to continue their apostolic work along the border near Fukien and Kwangsi. The report was cabled from China by the Most Rev. James E. Walsh, Maryknoll Superior General, who is there for a visitation of missions staffed by Maryknoll priests and sisters.

From the neighboring Kowloon, Wuchow and Kwollin areas, the remainder of the 80 Maryknoll Sisters in South China have set up temporary mission quarters in Kwelyang, Kwailchow Province.
