Any Sunday morning when we sit down to have a cup of coffee with the boys who come to the Canteen we find them falling into conversation about "home." Stimulated by the good food and the amiable atmosphere they like to tell you about the places they come from; the things they do in "our town"; how they putter around the house. They like to talk about their families and even "Sister Sue," who was their biggest nuisance, they now remember as the "greatest little pal."

One boy told me recently that the grandest place in the world to live was just outside of Boston. In this model community there is constant competition in keeping the homes and the gardens and the lawns.

BOOSTS HOME TOWN
The business center is definitely a part by itself and there is no store nor business to mar the regimental beauty of the residential section. He boosted the friendliness and neighborliness of its citizens. It was common, he said, to have the man next door take care of the widow's lawn and the fellow down the street to put up the screens at a house where there was no man around.

Since he's been in the Navy he's been home three times but he's made up his mind that he is not going back anymore until Uncle Sam returns him bag and baggage. For, each leave he found it was harder to depart from that which he loved so much.

This is the way all of our boys talk about "home" whether it's a bustling big city or a cross roads "unincorporated." There is always something beautiful about every place in these United States of ours: the surrounding country side, the tree lined streets, the old-fashioned gardens, the modern buildings. All beautiful and unmolested.

The Canadian boys talk about their homes as much and with as much Chamber of Commerce selling. The old and lovely towns they come from; from the quaint villages in Quebec, from the gorgeous lake regions in the North, from the magnificent dispelling mountain section of the West. This also is "home" beautiful and unmolested.

BOMBED OUT AT HOME

But, the English boy speaks of "home" as a means for devastation by the violence of the ruthless Germans. Sometimes I wonder if they still remember how beautiful that WAS too. They have seen so much of cluttered streets and shattered buildings; debris strewn gardens and pitted fields. They have lived so long among ruined homes and the whizz and whurr of the destructive bombs. Yet, one young lad, from Norfolk, in a hardly understandable accent who one might believe had not yet come of age to give thought to the beautiful wonders of Nature and the grandeur of the hillside, immediately began conversation with me by comparing countries and telling me how really lovely the lands of Norfolk are and how as one of the Home Guard he stood by his guns to protect them whenever the raid signals chilled the air.

Mind you, he was only fourteen then but it was these youngsters who were left to guard from injury their home and their people while the men had gone away to fight the battle. He was happy that Norfolk had never been harmed. That it still lay in peace and quiet.

Says Card. Hlond Deported To Reich on Invasion Eve

LONDON. (NC)—His Eminence August Cardinal Hlond, Primate of Poland, was deported from Barle Duc, France, into Germany on the eve of the Allied invasion of France, according to a statement issued here by the Polish Government-in-Exile.

Two months ago, the statement said, the Nazis asked Cardinal Hlond to become Regent of Poland.

Italian Clergy Brave Under Nazi Yolk

NEW YORK.—The attitude of the Italian clergy under the Nazi occupation was "extremely courageous," states an article in the Swiss paper Basler Nachrichten, according to a report of the Office of War Information here.

The priests always supported the righteous cause in their sermons, the article is reported to have said, defending persecuted Jews and aiding the afflicted.

Loreto Sanctuary, Hit by German Air Attack, Virtually Restored

NEW YORK. (NC)—Restoration of the Loreto Sanctuary, which was damaged during a German air attack the night of July 5-6, is nearly completed, according to a dispatch from overseas to the Office of War Information. The repair work is being carried out by the Capuchin monks at Loreto in cooperation with the Allied authorities, the dispatch said, and is being financed by Vatican City. The dispatch said that, according to reports from Allied art experts, who inspected the buildings, work is well along on the roofing of the Basilica and of the Palazzo

del Collegio and restorations in the library and archives are complete. The hole in the drum of the dome has been repaired, but the frescoes by Cesare Staccare are destroyed partly.

The reports of the Allied experts re-establish that the Nazi attack on the shrine was deliberate, the dispatch said, adding that evidence given by the Capuchins "leaves little doubt on this score." It is stated that the attack was carried out in full moonlight and that the Cathedral of the Madonna, the Sanctuary of the Holy Family and the other buildings clearly were visible.
