eral phases of Rochester's war program. On Thursdays a group meets at the clubhouse to make surgical dressings. Many are serving regularly in the office of Civilian Defense, ration boards as well as conducting Red Cross courses in Home Nursing and First Aid. Approximately \$25,000 has been sold in war stamps and bonds.

A camp for girls at Canandaigua Lake, two Girl Scout troops, a Business Women's Group, a group that sews for home and foreign missions and another that gives service to those confined to their homes by illness or age are among the more prominent achievements of the club.

Says Pope Gives Proof As 'Common Father'

MONTEVIDEO, (U.S.P.) — His Holiness Pope Pius XII, "rising given effective proof that he is the common Father not only of Catholics but of all men," the weekly Civismo says in reply to a criticism of the periodical Marcha that the Vatican "oscillates alternately" in its attitude toward the belligerents. The Holy Father, Civismo points out, has "condemned all unjust attacks, aided all men without distinction, protested time and again against the cruel methods employed in warfare, has not yielded to the strongest pressure of Fascism when it was lord and master of Italy, and, has never ceased to strive for an authentic peace based on justice."
