"Wipe God out of time and eternity and you destroy all codes of fixed morality," the Archbishop asseried; "you reject all saccions you rob law of all basis, you enthrone might as the only force to govern—nations and peoples, you set up a totalitarian government for every Godless country. This anti-God philosophy has brought about the apostasy of the nations and the moral anarchy that exists in the world today."

Declaring that in the past agposticism had been imported from the German universities, Arch. bashop McNicholas charged that "today we are importing atheism, Atheistic communism, and atheistic liberalism from the Old World."

"Many misguided persons are encouraging atheistic liberalism in America," he said. "These degrading ideologies are worse than typhus or leprosy. If their exponents gain control of government we inevitably shall have totalitarianism followed by civil and intermational war."

The Archbishop said every totalltarian government "must reject God if it wishes to continue totalitarian," and that the world cannot be freed of moral anarchy unless 'a supreme, all powerful, and all-knowing God he accepted and worshipped as the Ruler of individuals and of nations, to whom all persons and all officials of government are accountable."

"If this basic truth of the unlverse be not the unchangeable conviction of the home, of civic society, and of every religious demomination," he warned, "we shall have endless wars and confusion
