Navy Honors Parish Giving Three Priests to Services

In colorful ceremonies honoring Church Recognition Day, proclaimed by Rear Admiral William R. Monroe, Commandant of the Third Naval District, the Army-Navy Certificate of Honor was awarded Our Lady of Good Counsel Church for providing three chaplains for the nation's armed forces.

Immediately following the 40 hours' devotion service at Good Counsel, Sunday, Oct. 8, the parade and raising of the colors was held, with over 600 parishioners and representatives of various local veterans' organizations marching.

A letter of commendation, addressed to the Rev. Edward T. Meagher, Pastor, was read to the congregation by Lieut. A. P. O'Neill, USNR, of the local Office of Naval Officer Procurement, as representative of the armed forces and on behalf of Secretary of the Navy, James Forrestal.

Lieutenant O'Neill expressed the gratitude of the Navy to the Church and congregation for releasing their priests, the Rev. Gerald Kelly, the Rev. William P. Nolan and the Rev. Raymond G. Helzel, for their country's service.

In his address, the Lieutenant said in part:

"The purpose of this ceremony is to assure the folks at home that the Navy is vitally interested in the spiritual welfare of its personnel both ashore and afloat. The Navy needs men and men need God. Put them both together and you will see that the Navy needs men of God."

Father Meagher, in his acceptance of the award said that he

was speaking for the entire parish when he declared: "It is with a deep sense of appreciation to the United States Government that we humbly accept this signal honor conferred on this parish for the surrender of her priestly sons and a deeper sense of gratitude to God, that this government recognized even in this award that it is under the merciful protection of our all-loving God."

Chaplain Loughlin Honored in Award to St. Bernard Seminary

The Certificate of Honor of the Navy Department has been presented to St. Bernard's Seminary, in honor of Marine Chaplain John J. Loughlin, former faculty member.

Accompanying the certificate was a letter signed by Secretary of the Navy, James Forrestal, commanding St. Bernard's for its "patriotic sacrifice" and presenting the testimonial as permanent evidence of St. Bernard's contribution in behalf of the religious life of the men and women of our armed forces.

"It is a matter of deep personal satisfaction to me," wrote Mr. Forrestal, "to be able thus to express the appreciation and thanks of the Navy Department and myself."

Chaplain Loughlin, a native of Elmira, was with the first wave of assault troops to hit the beaches of Tarawa. For his outstanding service there, he was awarded the Legion of Merit.
