VENRAY, the Netherlands —

(NL)—Amid the burst of German

mortar shells and the roar of British

artillery fire, a staff of nuns helped

in the evacuation of 3,300

mental patients here.

The patients were moved in a

large fleet of British Army ambulances.

The women patients were

taken from St. Anna's Asylum

and the men from a hospital ad-

joining the St. Servatius Monas-

tery.

Both these institutions are

pocked with shell holes, window

less and without heating, lighting

or cooking facilities.
