Powers Dictate Says De Valera

DUBLIN — (Delayed) — (ENS) — Unsettled world conditions for "some time to come" will prevent the organization of an effective international body to safeguard peace, Premier Eamon DeValera of Eire declared here (Nov. 1) in a talk at Trinity College.

Until sufficient coercive power is placed at the control of a central authority designated to prevent aggression there can be no lasting peace, he asserted. He declared also that a policy of dictation by the great powers is being substituted for the sway of the dictator nations and predicted many differences will arise among the victorious countries once hostilities have ended.

From the viewpoint of the smaller nations, "some democratic form of the Geneva organization" is desired, he concluded.

The holy season of Advent is at hand and Franciscans, remembering the devotion of their founder to the Holy Child and to the Christmas miracle, will prepare their minds and hearts in a manner befitting his example.

In honoring St. Francis of Assisi with special devotions at this season of the year, it is good to recall that he is credited with having given us the Christmas Crib.

Only a few years before his death, St. Francis built a Christmas Crib to celebrate the Nativity of Christ. "He made ready a manger," St. Bonaventure tells us, "and had hay, together with an ox and an ass, he brought unto the spot. The Friars were called together, the people assembled, the wood echoed with their voices, and the night was made radiant and solemn with many bright lights, and with timely and honourous praises. The man of God, filled with tender love, stood before the manger, bathed in tears and overflowing with joy. A solemn Mass was sung over the manger, Francis chanting the Holy Gospel."

Francis is also credited with having said: "If I were to speak to the Emperor, I would tell him for the love of God and me to make a special law... that all the magistrates of the towns, and the lords of castles and villages, should be bound every year on Christmas Day to compel men to throw wheat and other grains outside the cities and castles, that our sister larks may have something to eat... Whoever shall have an ox and an ass shall be bound to provide for them on that night the best of good fodder. Likewise on that day, all poor men should be satisfied by the rich with good food." St. Francis has shown us how to love the Christ Child.
