### First Division Marine Home on Furlough; Two Girls in WACs

CORNING—Another member of the famous First Division of the U. S. Marines to arrive at his home during the past week was Corp. Patrick Bonady. He is recuperating at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Michael Bonady, 1st Hillview Ave., from wounds received in the South Pacific.

Corp. Bonady has seen action in major battles in the South Pacific, having been with the First Division at Guadalcanal. He is the holder of citations from Maj. Gen. Alexander A. Vandegrift and the late Secretary of Navy Frank Knox.

Two Corning young women are now taking basic training at the Third WAC Training Center at Fort Oglethorpe, Ga. They are Pvt. Malvina M. Colaccechi, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Albert Colaccechi, 2 Weaver St., and Pvt. Dorothy Reynolds, daughter of Mrs. Mary Reynolds, 264 Walnut St. The latter was the leader of the contingent which left from this area.

Both Pvt. Colaccechi and Pvt. Reynolds are former Corning Glass Works employees and both have brothers in the service. Sgt. Joseph Colaccechi has been in the South Pacific with the Infantry for more than three years. Pvt. Leo Reynolds, who has been in the Army two years, recently arrived in Southern France.

A recent communication from Sgt. John Kester to his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Lynn Kester, 248 Dodge Ave., included a copy of a newspaper published by the 82nd Airborne Division of which the sergeant is a member. The paper, which bore the dateline Nijmegen, Holland, Oct. 17, is called the "All American Paraglide."

A full account of the part played by the 82nd in the liberation of Holland was given in the newspaper. Sgt. Kester is now located in France, he informed his parents.

According to a dispatch from Cherry Point, N. C., Michael R. Gulla, son of Mrs. Sam Gulla, 117 W. Market St., has been promoted from corporal to sergeant in the Marine Corps at that base.
