

2 Catholic Youths Die, 4 Wounded in War

Action in Germany claimed the lives of two Catholic boys from this area; four are reported wounded on various battlefronts; two are missing and one is reported back on duty after having been reported missing. The War Casualty reports reveal this week.

Pfc. Gordon C. Reits, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon A. Reits, 110 Ridgeview Dr., Forest Hills, was killed in action in Germany Nov. 24. The War Department has informed the parents. A former honor student at East Rochester High School, Private Reits attended Niagara University for two years before he began service in June, 1943. He took a course in engineering before his transfer to the Infantry. Overseas only a few months, he was a member of the First Army.

Surviving besides his parents are a brother, Frank, 16, and sister, Chair Reits.

Pvt. Anthony Bellavia, 19, of St. Jerome's parish, East Rochester, was killed in action Dec. 18 in Germany, according to word received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Bellavia, 130 W. Maple Ave., East Rochester.

Immediately after graduation from high school, Private Bellavia entered the Army and had been

overseas four months.

Survivors include three sisters, Angelina, Mary and Josephine Bellavia of East Rochester, and five brothers, James and John Bellavia of East Rochester and Thomas, Samuel and Charles Bellavia of Rochester.

Pfc. Edward G. Miller, 19, parishioner of St. Boniface Church, was seriously wounded in Infantry action Nov. 26 in France, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Miller, 51 Caroline St., have learned.

Private Miller had completed his work as apprentice at Corbett Steeves Pattern Works when he began service in April, 1943. He has been overseas since July.

Pvt. Louis Chilcott, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Chilcott, and husband of Mrs. Lena Chilcott, all of East Rochester, was wounded Sept. 30 in action in Holland and has been brought to Brooks General Hospital in Utica.

A former employee at the Lawrence Brothers Paper Millers, Sergeant Chilcott served in the older Infantry after he entered service. He has been overseas more than a year.

Pvt. Charles G. Bordonearo, 19, 178 Lexington Ave., was seriously wounded in France Nov. 18, the War Department has informed his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Samuel A. Bordonearo of Holy Rosary parish.

Private Bordonearo was a member of the New York State Guard before his enrollment in the Army Dec. 8, 1943. Going overseas towards the end of July he arrived in France about two months ago.

Pvt. Thomas M. Hegerty, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas E. Hegerty, of Middlesex, was seriously wounded
