VATICAN CITY (CNS) — References made by His Holiness Pope Pius XII this Christmas season to the confusion surrounding the word "Democracy" is taken by observers to be an answer to Communist propaganda regarding "Progressive Democracy."

This confusion, spoken of at some length in the Holy Father's Christmas Message broadcast to the world on Christmas Eve, was also alluded to when the Sovereign Pontiff received the Roman Prelates in audience and heard their seasonal greetings expressed by His Eminence, Cardinal Granillo Fieschi, of the Sacred College.

**Death in Battle Claims Two Soldiers From Painted Post**

CORNING — Two vicinity homes were saddened during the week after Christmas when word was received that Pvt. William Gethin had been killed in action in Germany and that Staff Sergeant Francis H. Schilberger had died on Dec. 10 as the result of severe wounds received the previous day.

Pvt. Gethin, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Fay Peutaman of 123 W. Water St., Painted Post, was first reported missing in action on Nov. 30 by the War Department in a telegram to his wife, the former Miss Anna Cotter of Painted Post. He entered the service in the Fall of 1941 and has been overseas for several months as a member of a tank division. Before his enlistment he was employed at the Ingersoll Rand Company. He was a member of St. Vincent de Paul's Parish.

In addition to his wife and parents, Pvt. Gethin is survived by three sisters, Mrs. Howard Coates of Painted Post and Beverly and Dorothy Prutzman at home; one brother, Richard Gethin of Corning.

Staff Sergeant Schilberger, 22, was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis L. Schilberger, 78 W. Third St., Corning. He was a member of the famous 399th Infantry Regiment of the 100th Century Division and had been overseas only since Oct. 20, 1944.

Sgt. Schilberger, who attended St. Mary's School and was a graduate of Corning Free Academy, enlisted in the Army in November, 1942. Before going overseas he served as an Infantry instructor for Rangers and Commandos at Ft. Bragg, N. C.

Besides his parents he is survived by two brothers, Corp Robert, serving with the Army in the Pacific and David, at home; a grandmother, Mrs. Jessie Welch of Corning and several aunts and uncles.

**Aids Native Clergy**



Rev. Ignatius T. Glennie, S. J., of New Orleans, who has been appointed rector of the Papal Seminary at Kandy, Ceylon. Father Glennie, who is 37 years old, is the first American rector of this important seminary for training native priests, established 61 years ago by Pope Leo the XIIIth. It has supplied 450 native priests and six native bishops for mission dioceses in India, Ceylon and Burma. With other Jesuits of the New Orleans province he has been laboring in Ceylon since 1936. **Maryknoll NCCS Hosts to 200 Chaplains in First 4 Months**

WASHINGTON (CNS) — More than 200 Catholic chaplains with the Allied Forces in the Italian theater of war were guests at the Maryknoll House in Rome during the first four-and-a-half months of its operation as a hostel affiliated with the National Catholic Community Service.

This is revealed in a report to NCCS headquarters here from the Very Rev. Frederick C. Deltz, M. M., Procurator General of the Maryknoll Fathers in Rome.

Father Deltz reports that 170 chaplains were overnight guests at the hostel and had spent an average of three or four days there. Many returned for second and third visits, the report states, while some chaplains stationed nearby "are in and out frequently, sometimes for a night, sometimes for a few hours." Approximately 60 others "have dropped in on their way through Rome, having official billets elsewhere in the city," Father Deltz reports.
