 Bernatone, 132 W. Chestnut St., East Rochester, serving in the armed forces, suffered slight wounds in France Dec. 8, according to word reaching his mother.

Private Bernatone began service in March 1943, going overseas last July.

His brothers are: Charles, stationed in England; George, France; and John, aboard a U.S. Army hospital ship.

Pvt. William Shernata, 23, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Shernata, 137 Alphonse St., was slightly wounded in infantry action Dec. 5. In Germany, the parents have been advised.

He entered service in May 1943 and has been overseas since Jan. 1944.

Serving in the Philippines is a brother, Pvt. James Shernata. Both are on the honor roll at St. Joseph's church.

Wounded in France Aug. 10, Pvt. John Romanik, 23, husband of Miss Carol Romanik, 7 Riverbank Pl., is now in the convalescent hospital at Camp Upton, L.I., following a furlough at home.

Member of a medical detachment, Private Romanik was hit in the hand with shrapnel. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Romanik, 1 Besse Rd.

Entering service in November,

he went overseas in October 1943. The soldier is a member of St. Joseph's church.

Another St. Joseph's parishioner, Pvt. Michael Matkoski Jr., 19, was wounded in action. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Matkoski, 171 Berlin St., private Matkoski is hospitalized in England for wounds received Nov. 16 in action in France. The infantryman worked for the American Brake Shoe Co. before his induction July 1, 1943. He went overseas in September.

Pvt. Walter J. Blieck, Jr., 22, was wounded slightly in France Dec. 16. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Walter J. Blieck, 226 West St., have been notified.

Member of a tank division, Private Blieck was sent overseas in October. He entered the Army Nov. 30, 1943, and attended St. Stanislaus church.

Pvt. Thaddeus Koenigk, 29, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Koenigk, 57 Peckham St., was wounded Oct. 1 in the fighting on Bougivalville, according to word reaching his wife, Gertrude Koenigk, of the Peckham Street address. A member of St. Stanislaus church, Private Koenigk entered service in September, 1943, and arrived overseas in February, 1944.

Mrs. Eleonore Gibson, 1087 Culver Rd., has been advised that her

brother, Pfc. Theodore J. Jasnowski, 22, was wounded Nov. 24 in the island of Leyte. Wounded in the foot while fighting with a shore battalion, he has received the Purple Heart. Before entering service, Private Jasnowski lived at 106 St. Stanislaus St. He lost a brother, Charles, who died of a heart ailment last March in Army service on the Gilbert Islands.

Pvt. William J. Farrell, 21, member of St. John the Evangelist church, was wounded in infantry action Nov. 22 on Leyte. The son of Mr. and Mrs. W. J. Farrell, 206 Tarrington Rd., Private Farrell fought in the Hollandia and Philippines campaigns. Entering service in October, 1943, he went overseas in March 1944. Two brothers are in service, Pfc. Mass for the bereavement of Pvt. Joseph N. De Salvo, wounded in action in Germany, was offered Jan. 14 in the Church of the Annunciation. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Nicholas De Salvo, 172 Taft St., the Mayo Island soldier, who has been four years of service, was wounded by shrapnel from Nazi Mortars near Vassadel, Germany.

Pvt. Charles Giulini, 21, who attended the study of St. Stanislaus church, was wounded in action Dec. 10 in France. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Michael Giulini, 16 Vetter St., have been informed.

Entering the service in November, 1943, Private Giulini went overseas two months ago with a tank unit. A brother, Pfc. Michael Giulini, is serving with U.S. Armed Forces in France.

Pvt. James Gibney, Down Rochester lightweight boxer, was wounded in action on Leyte Dec. 23. A buddy's letter received by the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Gibney, 16 Love St., states that Private Gibney, a machine gunner with the Infantry, was shot in the right arm.

He entered service three years ago and spent his training period instructing in boxing and running boxing contests, receiving official commendation for his work. He has been overseas a year.

A graduate of St. Peter Paul's School, he was a truck driver for the City Waste Disposal System before entering.

Pvt. James F. DiMauro, husband of Mrs. Adeline DiMauro, 8 Kendall St., is hospitalized in England after being wounded in battle for the second time. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael DiMauro, 429 Orange St., Private DiMauro has his leg and figures he will be in the hospital for "several months." He was wounded first in France on July 32. Formerly a contractor, the soldier attended St. Francis Assisi church. He has a brother, Pvt. Nicholas DiMauro, serving with an artillery unit in France.

Wounded Nov. 20 in Germany, Pvt. Peter F. Bialka, 32, is now in a hospital in England. His mother, Mrs. Isadore Bialka, 145 Marquette St., has learned.entering the service in May, Private Bialka has been overseas two months. A brother, Lt. John Bialka, serving in Germany, wears the Air Medal. Both are on the honor roll at St. Therese of the Child Jesus church.

Cpl. Guy V. Basso, 22, of St. Jerome's, East Rochester, has been missing in action over Germany since Dec. 17, his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Vincent Basso, 128 W. Chestnut St., East Rochester, have been advised. In service since February, 1942, Corporal Basso, engineer and top turret gunner on a Fortress, has been overseas since November.

A brother, George LaMackie, has been overseas since June, 1943.

Cpl. Kenneth Mazzoni, 22, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Mazzoni, 720 Genesee St., has been missing over Germany since Dec. 19. His parents have learned. Member of many Army clubs, Kenneth Corporal Mazzoni enlisted in the Air Corps on Feb. 1, 1943. He has been overseas since Sept. 1943.

Missing in action over a year ago and was a prisoner of the Italians.

Pvt. William N. Taylor of St. Andrew's parish, who has been listed missing in action in France since Sept. 16, is now reported a prisoner of the German Government. His mother, Mrs. Louise Clegg, 22 Pomery St., has learned. Entering the Army in February 1943, Private Taylor went to Cleve and College, N.C., under the Army Specified Training program and was transferred to the Infantry where the program was discontinued.
