## 500 Tots Without Homes—Foster Parents Sought

Appeals to the citizens of Rochester to open their homes to the 500 children who during 1945 will be added to the child-care list of the city's social agencies, will be pressed during a two-week home-finding campaign opening Sunday.

The people of the city with comfortable homes and time for families, will be asked to estimate the role of foster parents for these youngsters who have been torn from their own families by reason of illness, death or other circumstances that have broken up their homes.

The wartime demand for women industrial workers, and the Selective Service have combined to cut down drastically the number of foster homes that are normally available to the agencies for the temporary care of dislocated children. The foster-home shortage has grown so acute that the children are suffering from too many shifts between institutions and the available homes, the agencies point out. It is the children who have been the brunt of the hardship.

Joining in the appeal for homes are the Hillside Home for Children, Jewish Social Service Bureau, Rochester Catholic Charities, Society for the Prevention of Cruel-

ty to Children and Monroe County Child Placement Division.

Requirements for foster parents are fairly simple. The children's needs are for clean, comfortable and harmonious surroundings, regardless of the economic level of the foster-parent family. Within certain requirements by the state any couple between the ages of 21 and 65 is eligible. The children must be placed in homes of their own religion — Catholic, Protestant or Jewish.

Prospective parents are being asked to contact the agencies directly.

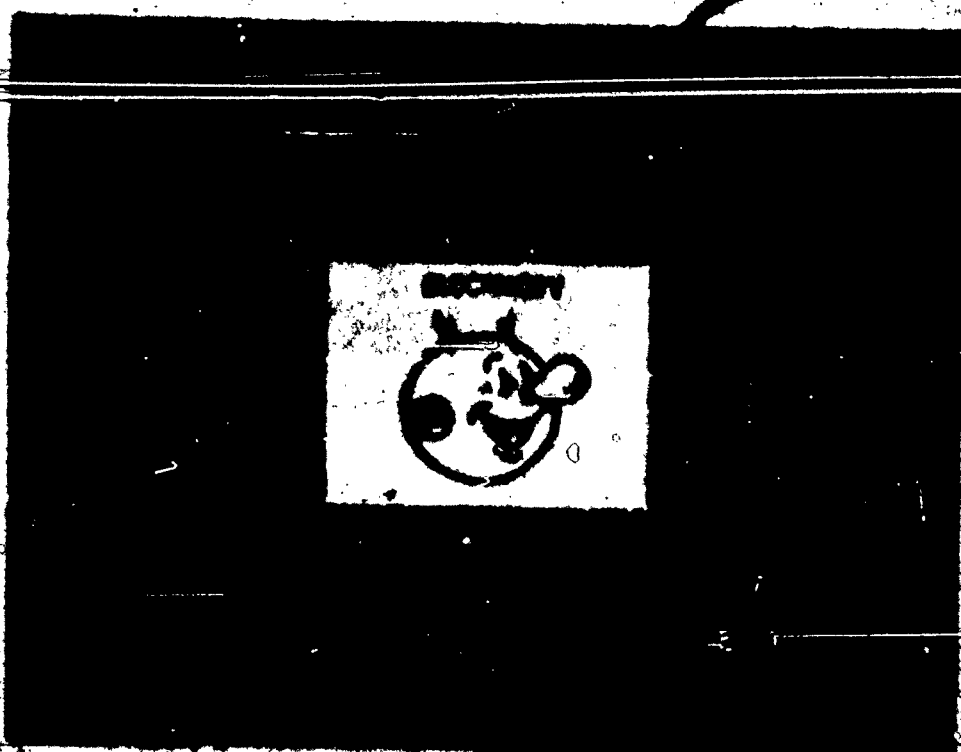
