

## Postal Notes Now on Sale

Postmaster Donald A. Dailey announces that on Feb. 1 a new service will be offered in the post office. Postal Notes will be on sale at all five cents post offices on and after that date.

Postal Notes will be sold for amounts from one cent to ten dollars and the fee for each Note will be five cents. No application will be required - the purchaser will merely write in the name and address of the payee and sign his own name. The Notes may be drawn on any post office in Continental United States, even though not all post offices will have them at present. Banks will cash them the same as post office money orders.

Another new feature is that Postal Note Stamps will be issued Postmark first to make up any odd amounts desired by the purchasers. The Notes will be issued in even dollars and the cents will be indicated by the Postal Note Stamps affixed to the Notes. These Stamps will be cancelled by the clerks who sell the Postal Notes. No other stamp will be valid for this purpose. Should a patron desire to send \$7.25 (seven dollars and eighty-five cents), he will be handed a Postal Note for \$7.00, attached to which will be one \$1.00 stamp and one for 25. The total cost will be \$7.25, plus the fee of 5¢, making a total of \$7.30. It is believed that these Postal Notes will be very popular, but post offices money orders will still be available for any who prefer to use them.
