# Communists Fear Church Most, Says Geo. Sokolsky

**BALTIMORE (NC)**—The world should realize that in these days we are witnessing a gigantic struggle between the Catholic Church and Communism, as represented by Soviet Russia, George Sokolsky, nationally-known newspaper columnist, declared in an address at a crowded meeting here last week of the Baltimore and Washington Holy Name Union.

Communism has a philosophy which is completely antagonistic to the philosophy of the Catholic Church. Mr. Sokolsky declared, while in His Holiness Pope Pius XII the Catholic Church has the representative, world-embracing champion of the rights of man. The Church is the foe which Communism fears most, he asserted.

Comparing Catholicism and Communism, Mr. Sokolsky said that the Catholic Church always emphasizes that man is a creature of God, endowed with free will which distinguishes him above all other creatures. On the other hand, Communism is based on a philosophy which denies man's free will by making him a tool of the state.

The Catholic Church recognizes the dignity of man, Communism makes him a puppet, he added.

## Anniversary Mass Said at Tomb of Apostle of Peace

**VATICAN CITY (NC)**—A Mass was said at the tomb of Pope Benedict XV in the crypt of St. Peter's Basilica on Jan. 28, the twenty-third anniversary of his death.

Pope Benedict XV, who had been chosen Cardinal-Bishop of Cremona, was elected to the Papacy on September 3, 1914, just a month after the outbreak of World War I. He died on January 22, 1922, seven years and four months after his election. His pontificate embraced virtually all of the great war and the first years of the post-war period. Pope Benedict worked conscientiously to halt the spread of World War I and to bring it to an end as early as possible.

Among representatives present to mark the thirtieth anniversary of his pontificate was the reigning pontiff, His Holiness Pope Pius XII, who went to Germany in 1927 to deliver his Plea for Peace, calling for cessation of hostilities, reduction of armaments, freedom of the seas and international arbitration. President Wilson, the only head of a government who answered him, declared peace was impossible, but he adopted the plan of Pope Benedict's program for international peace.
