

Spiritual Revival Shown in Paris By Mass Meeting

PARIS (By William R.N.S.)—Indicative of a revival of spiritual interest in France, a massive meeting attended by thousands of men and women of all ages, classes and denominations, was held here under the auspices of the weekly religious newspaper "Temps des Chrétiens." Chairman was Maurice Schumann, prominent de Gaulleist, and leaders of the religious world spoke.

The Rev. Pierre Chabot, S.J., founder of "Cahiers du Temps des Chrétiens" and outstanding religious worker in the resistance movement, stressed the "magnificent work" done by Catholics during the occupation, while André Mandouze, editor of "Temps des Chrétiens," urged all Christians to unite in reconstructing the country.

Another speaker, André Villette, discussed the distress among workers and urged that they be allowed to participate in organization of factories and that they be given a civil education.

War Veterans Sponsor High School Contest

NEW YORK Students of the nation's 30,000-day High Schools will participate in the National Essay Contest sponsored by the Catholic War Veterans, Inc.

The topic will be "AMERICA'S YOUTH AND THE BILL OF RIGHTS." First prize will be \$1,000 War Bond. Fifty additional prizes of \$100 War Bonds will be presented to boys and girls submitting essays of special merit, according to Miss Ruth K. Manning, National Third Vice-Chairwoman of C.W.V., and District Supervisor of High Schools, Board of Education, City of New York.

The Board of Judges will be composed of the Most Rev. Richard J. O'Conor, D.D., Archbishop of Boston, Chairman; the Most Rev. Bernard J. Sholl, D.D., Army Bishop of Chicago; William L. Chenevay, Publisher of Catholic's, the National Weekly; Rt. Rev. Msgr. Edward J. Flanagan of Boys Town, Nebraska; Commander James J. (Gene) Tunney, U.B.N.K., Washington, D.C.; and Eddie Rickenbacker, President & General Manager of Eastern Air Lines, New York City.

The contest closes at midnight, March 31, 1945. Essays are limited to 200 words or less.

Letters have been mailed to the principals of the country's 30,000 day High Schools advising them of the contest and inviting their students to compete.
