The priest and nuns were fed a lot of Japanese propaganda, the Corporal reports, about brutalities of the American people and how all the Indians in America had been killed and their land taken from them.

When the U. S. last forces hit the island, the priest thought the end had come to all of his missionaries, but to his surprise they were treated kindly...

The missionaries are now allowed to continue their religious teaching and a school system under civil affairs rule, has been set up for the natives.


