WARSAW (By Wireline-REB)—Historic St. John's Cathedral, Warsaw's oldest church, was among the many ecclesiastical buildings destroyed during the German occupation of the Polish capital. All that remains intact is a plaque recording outstanding events in the cathedral's history.
