

Patriotism Declines As Religion Is Lost, Says Boston Prelate

BOSTON (NC) — Tyranny of the State is the next inevitable step "once we surrender a belief in God as the source of our rights," the Most Rev. Richard J. Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, said in a discourse emphasizing that the practice of religion is intertwined with true patriotism.

The Archbishop addressed members of the Catholic Club of Boston College. His subject was "America, Land of Freedom and Religion."

"As the practice of religion has fallen off in America," Archbishop Cushing declared, "we fear there has been a lossening of patriotism. If love of country and love of freedom and justice and truth have their beginning in God Who is all truth and justice, then it must follow that a man who dedicates to honor God and practice faith in His provident care and protection will also show little respect or blind homage for the blessings of liberty and the joys of living in a country free and independent."

The foundation of this nation, Archbishop Cushing said, rests upon one of the great principles of Christianity, unassociated and disassociated by the followers of Christ before: "the power of paganism and the abomination of man, that all men are equal in their natural dignity, equal in their destiny, equal in the right of

recognition by all their fellow beings."

"Once we surrender a belief in God," the Archbishop said, "in the source of our rights, then the next inevitable step is tyranny of the State. For if we do not believe in God and affirm that He is the source of our freedom, then the state logically comes to the fore and sets itself up not only as the custodian of our rights but claims to be the sole source of them. It is the beginning of tyranny which is the end of the liberties of men. So long as man has a firm belief in God as the source of his life and salvation, just as long is man free to assert his freedom and even to die in its behalf."
