Catholic Casualties Report 8 Giving Lives, 11 as Wounded

Action on three war fronts has taken the lives of eight Catholic men of the diocese and wounded eleven, according to reports reaching the parishes this week.

These Made Supreme Sacrifice

Only son of Mr. and Mrs. James F. Bogan, 1008 Lake Ave., Private Bogan was a member of a tank destroyer company which went overseas in January, 1944. Wounded in France on Aug. 1, he had been awarded the Purple Heart. He met death just two weeks after returning to action from a hospital in England. He entered service in January, 1942.

Requiem Mass was offered Saturday, Feb. 17, 1945, in Immaculate Conception Church for Pfc. Joseph M. Byrne, 26, member of the parish who was killed in action Jan. 31 in Belgium. The War Department communication was received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas E. Byrne of 123 Champlain St. Private Byrne went into service three years ago. Overseas with an infantry unit for the past two years, he had served in England, Northern Ireland and France. Surviving besides his parents are two brothers, Thomas R. and John P. Byrne.

Pfc. John Connor, 22, was killed in action in Luxembourg Jan. 27, according to information received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Raymond E. Connor of Rush. The infantryman was the only son in the family.

Requiem Mass will be offered Saturday, Feb. 24, at 9 a. m. in St. Joseph's Church, Rush. In service since Jan. 1, 1944, Private Connor went overseas in June and won the Combat Infantryman's Badge for action with the Third Army in France and Germany. Five sisters also survive: Mrs. James Lagan, Honeoye Falls, and Mary, Grace, Katherine and Margaret of Rush.

S 1/2 Henry Madock, 21, is presumed dead, as a result of the explosion of his ship in the Central Pacific area, the Navy Department has informed his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Peter M. Madock of 69 Trafalgar St. Seaman Madock went into service last May and had been at sea since September.

Other survivors are three brothers, Pfc. Madock, serving in Germany; First Lt. Francis, Texas, and S 1/2 Victor Madock, Sampson, and three sisters, Helen, Margaret and Violet Madock.

Requiem services for the repose of the soul of Seaman 1/2 Edward A. Mallick, presumed dead by the Navy Department, were held in St. Joseph's Church, Thursday, Feb. 22, 1945. Son of Charles F. Mallick, 120

N. Walter St., and Mrs. Mallick, Winter Haven, Fla., the 12-year-old seaman had been listed missing since Nov. 10 when his ship exploded somewhere in the Central Pacific. He went into the Navy in May, 1944, and had been aboard ship since September.

He also leaves a brother, Lt. Charles F. Mallick Jr., who is serving with the Third Army in Europe.

Second Lt. Frederick D. Leary, 22, husband of Bellwoods C. Leary, was killed in action in Germany on Feb. 8, his parents Mr. and Mrs. Frederick J. Leary, 430 East Ave., have been advised by the War Department. (Lieutenant Leary is a nephew of Mary Leary of the Propagation of the Faith Office.)

Requiem Mass will be offered in St. Louis Church, Pittsford, Sunday, Mar. 4, at 11 a. m.

Enlisting in September, 1940, Lieutenant Leary, then a member of the Signal Corps, went overseas the same year. After serving in Puerto Rico for two years he returned to this country and went into Officer's Candidate School at Fort Monmouth, N. J. Commissioned in November, 1942, he went

overseas in September, 1943. Surviving besides his parents are a sister, Rosemary Leary and two

grandmothers, Mrs. William Leary and Mrs. Frances Reeb of this city.

Previously reported missing, Pfc. Joseph P. Martone, 19, one of twin sons of Mr. and Mrs. Palay Martone, 12 Essex, was killed in action in France Jan. 4, according to information received by the parents.

Requiem Mass will be offered in St. Peter and Paul's Church at an undecided date in March. The infantryman leaves his twin brother with the Seabees in the South Pacific; another brother, Pfc. J. J., and two sisters, Rita and Ruby, all of Rochester.

Solemn Memorial services were conducted for Edmund Thad (Tom) Christopher P. Tambe, 19, presumed dead by the Navy Department, in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church Sunday, Feb. 19, 1945, by the Rev. Frank P. Hodson, pastor. Assisting were the Rev. John C. Newcomb and the Rev. Milton J. Kelly.

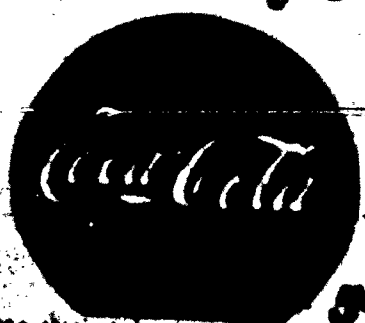
