**People Not Doing
Enough Thinking
Says Nun-Poetess**

People are not doing enough thinking today even on the natural level, Sister M. Madalena, C.M.C., outstanding woman poet, warned a near capacity audience at Aquinas Auditorium Sunday evening.

Speaking here in the seventh of the season's Christian Culture Lectures, Sister Madalena, president of St. Mary's College, Ind., deplored the inability of a vast majority of students to appreciate Christian philosophy and poetry.

The speaker, considered one of the leading poets of the times, compared her own method of writing with the Maritain theory of divining the spiritual in natural things.

Declaring that 90 percent of modern students overlook the supernatural in their contemplation of the natural world, Sister pointed out that no person is truly a philosopher or poet who does not see "the likeness of God in His creation."

"We are in a state of international disorder today," she said, "because people have failed to attain God in their thinking."

"Every time we say the 'Hail Mary,'" the poetess explained, "we speak the language of archangels . . . every time we say the 'Our Father,' we pass the frontiers of philosophy. . . We are lifted into the realm of perfect truth."
