**Calls on Catholics To Work for Full Rights to Negroes**

WASHINGTON (NC) — The teachings of the Catholic Church stand for "the full, unqualified equality of the Negro with every other human being," declared the Rev. Dr. Francis J. Connell, C.S.B., R., associate professor of moral theology of Catholic University of America, at the first formal meeting of the Catholic Interracial Council here. "All Catholics," he said, "should work for the day when the Negro will be granted the fullness of his natural and civil rights in our land."  
 Dr. Connell outlined the Catholic doctrine of natural rights and continued: "Although these basic rights are sometimes linked in this country with the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution, it should be understood that they are prior to and independent of those documents, which are merely expressions of a guarantee by government that these natural rights shall be protected."  
 "That is the main point of distinction between our land and a nation under a totalitarian form of government," he said. "Over and above natural and civil rights there are supernatural rights. Through the merits of Jesus Christ the right to the supernatural life has been restored," he continued, "and all men without exception, whatever their color or race, have a right to the merits of Christ. He died for all; the graces of His redemption are for all; the Sacraments whereby His graces are distributed are for all; all without exception are summoned to be members of His One True church."  
 "The chief purpose in the Catholic Interracial Council is to eradicate the shameful blot on American justice and decency by the discrimination against Negroes that is so widespread and so deep-rooted in our land," he concluded.

**Increased Population, Contraceptive Ad Ban Urged in Australia**

**MELBOURNE (By Radio)**—Extension into the post-war era of legislation prohibiting advertisements of contraceptives, now banned under the National Security Act, is recommended in a report by Herbert Charles Bernard, chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Social Security, and Sir Henry Howard, Federal president of the British Medical Association. The report also urges medical services to promote larger families and growth of population in Australia.  
 "The report asserts that 'nothing could more surely enhance the security and prosperity of Australia than the rapid progressive increase in the indigenous population,' and adds that 'we strongly urge that everything should be done to encourage people to marry earlier and have larger families.'  
 "This natural increase would result," the report continues, "if the Government showed its appreciation of the vital importance of the problem by providing better housing, by financially assisting those prepared to undertake work abroad, and by helping to improve the amenities and lessen the drudgery of family life."  
 Minister of Mines Vincent Gair of Queensland said Australia's National Government has many ministers controlling departments dealing with various phases of national life and expressed the belief that the time is overdue for creating a Minister for Population, whose responsibilities would include continuous investigations along every possible avenue for increasing the population to a figure which would assure national stability.
