


Poland Shrine Safe

French Youth's Last Letter

FARIS (IN) — The family of Roger Picard, executed at Mont Valerien on July 28, 1940, has just received the publication of the admiring letter which he wrote to them that morning.

The 23-year-old Roger, son of a prominent Canadian and nephew of Andrew Macmillan, editor-in-chief of *Macmillan's Magazine* and France

Chaldeans, had spent three months in a cell at Mont Valerien. The torture which Roger went through before his execution was so terrible that he was incapable of propagandizing for the Germans and convincing them with his information. Before the German military tribunal he refused any defense: "I did my duty as a Frenchman. I am your enemy. I ask no favors."

His last letter reads:

"Adored Family: I am going to be shot soon now, at noon. It is now 1:15. This is a mixture of joy and sorrow. Forgive me for everything—the sorrow I have caused you, what I am causing you and what I shall cause you. Forgive me for everything—for the evil I have done and for all the good I did not do."

"My testament will be short: I desire you to keep poor Felicité. And mind, we helped her when she died. Love me mother, strong and, and the religion to which I have returned, and from which you have been separated in a region of hell."

"Traditional and old ways will always be best. I hope you will always be happy. I hope you will always be happy. Your son, grandson and brother who adore you."

McKeever Hailed As Cornell Coach

ITHACA (END) — Appointment of Bill McKeever as head football coach at Cornell University was hailed here this week as something akin to a popular referendum.

The Athletic Board of Cornell, which announced Thursday that Notre Dame's aging coach had been signed, revealed that he had chosen above more than 30 other candidates for the job left vacant by the resignation of Carl Beatty, and the move seemed to most here unanimous and enthusiastic approval.

McKeever will enter his 34 years old and he has spent nearly 20 of those years playing or coaching football, with the result that his career as acting head coach of Notre Dame last season was merely the finishing touch.

He will take over his duties at Cornell on April 1, and two weeks later will start spring practice, at which time he will make his plans for next football season. He is not committed to using the T-formation, which served him eight victories in 28 starts with the Irish last season and may instead come other systems. This will depend upon his material.
